This seventh Core (Level 2) calculator paper covers the whole Core syllabus: number, fractions/decimals/percentages, ratio, algebra, geometry, measures, coordinates, statistics and probability, using different questions from the first six Core calculator papers (CE.M15, CE.M21, CE.M28, CE.M32, CE.M37 and CE.M42).

- 1 One evening in Inverness, the temperature was 5 degrees C. Overnight it fell by 9 degrees C. Work out the temperature by morning. (1 mark)

- 2 Work out $725 + 468$. (1 mark)

(Total for Question 2 is 1 mark)

- 3 Work out $902 - 458$. (1 mark)

(Total for Question 3 is 1 mark)

- 4 Write these numbers in order of size, smallest first: 0.7, 0.17, 0.71, 0.07 (2 marks)

(Total for Question 4 is 2 marks)

5 Work out $5/9$ of 198. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 5 is 2 marks)

6 A pair of headphones in a shop in Leeds costs 96 pounds. In a sale it is reduced by 25%. Work out the amount of the discount. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 6 is 2 marks)

7 Chidi and Grace share 280 pounds in the ratio 3:4. Work out how much money Grace receives. (3 marks)

(Total for Question 7 is 3 marks)

8 Simplify $6a + 7b - 2a + 9b$. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 8 is 2 marks)

9 Solve these two equations.

(a) Solve $8x - 13 = 43$. (2 marks) (2)

(b) Solve $x/5 + 6 = 13$. (2 marks) (2)

(Total for Question 9 is 4 marks)

- 10** Two angles of a triangle are 58 degrees and 71 degrees. Work out the size of the third angle. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 10 is 2 marks)

- 11** A rectangle has length 21 cm and width 8 cm.

(a) Work out the area of the rectangle. (1 mark) (1)

(b) Work out the perimeter of the rectangle. (2 marks) (2)

(Total for Question 11 is 3 marks)

- 12** A cuboid has length 7 cm, width 5 cm and height 8 cm. Work out its volume. (3 marks)

(Total for Question 12 is 3 marks)

- 13** Convert 4830 grams into kilograms. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 13 is 2 marks)

- 14** On 24/07/2026, a train leaves a station in Bristol at 10:47 and arrives in London at 13:05. Work out how long the journey took. Give your answer in hours and minutes. (3 marks)

(Total for Question 14 is 3 marks)

- 15** A 300 g bag of rice costs 1.35 pounds and a 750 g bag of the same rice costs 3.15 pounds. Work out which bag gives better value for money. Show your working. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 15 is 2 marks)

- 16** The number of texts sent by a class over five days were: 52, 41, 36, 58, 33. Work out the mean number of texts. (3 marks)

(Total for Question 16 is 3 marks)

- 17** A box contains 8 red counters, 5 blue counters and 7 green counters. A counter is picked at random. Work out the probability that it is blue. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 17 is 2 marks)

- 18** Here are the first four terms of a sequence: 4, 10, 16, 22, ... Find the 18th term of the sequence. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 18 is 2 marks)

- 19** Point A has coordinates (6, 13) and point B has coordinates (18, 5). Work out the coordinates of the midpoint of AB. (2 marks)

(Total for Question 19 is 2 marks)

- 20** A laptop originally costs 540 pounds. The price is first reduced by 20% in a sale, and then a further 15 pounds is taken off the sale price. Work out the final price of the laptop. (3 marks)

(Total for Question 20 is 3 marks)

- 21** A cyclist named Idris trains near Bristol.

(a) Idris cycles 6.3 km in 1.4 hours. Work out his average speed in km/h. (1 mark) (1)

(b) Idris then cycles for a further 40 minutes at the same average speed. Work out the extra distance he cycles. (2 marks) (2)

(Total for Question 21 is 3 marks)

- 22** A market stall in Norwich buys mugs for 6 pounds each and sells them for 8.70 pounds each.

(a) Work out the stall's profit as a percentage of the price they paid. (2 marks) (2)

(b) The stall then reduces the selling price by 20% for a clearance sale. Work out the sale price. (2 marks) (2)

(Total for Question 22 is 4 marks)

23 Karim thinks of a number.

- (a) He multiplies his number by 5, then adds 7. The result is 82. Write down an equation in k to represent this, where k is Karim's number. (1 mark)

- (b) Solve your equation to find the value of k . (2 marks)

- (c) Karim's friend's number is 4 less than twice Karim's number. Find the friend's number. (1 mark)

24 An L-shaped patio belonging to a house near Norwich is made from two rectangles. The patio measures 16 m by 10 m overall, with a rectangular section measuring 5 m by 4 m removed from one corner for a garden shed.

- (a) Work out the area of the patio. (3 marks)

- (b) Paving costs 7.50 pounds per square metre. Work out the cost of paving the whole patio, giving your answer to the nearest 10 pounds. (1 mark)

25 In a class of 22 pupils, the mean mark in a science test was 62%. In a second class of 28 pupils, the mean mark was 75%. Work out the mean mark for all 50 pupils, giving your answer correct to 1 decimal place. (4 marks)

Question 1

- **B1** -4 (degrees C) cao
- **Answer: -4 degrees C**

Question 2

- **B1** 1193 cao
- **Answer: 1193**

Question 3

- **B1** 444 cao
- **Answer: 444**

Question 4

- **M1** evidence of comparing place value, e.g. writing 0.70, 0.17, 0.71, 0.07
- **A1** 0.07, 0.17, 0.7, 0.71 all in correct order cao
- **Answer: 0.07, 0.17, 0.7, 0.71**

Question 5

- **M1** $198 \div 9 (= 22)$ oe
- **A1** 110 cao
- **Answer: 110**

Question 6

- **M1** $96 \div 4 (= 24)$ oe, or equivalent method (e.g. 96×0.25)
- **A1** 24 pounds cao
- **Answer: 24 pounds**

Question 7

- **M1** identifies 7 total parts ($3 + 4$)
- **M1** $280 \div 7 (= 40)$, the value of one part
- **A1** 160 pounds cao
- **Answer: 160 pounds**

Question 8

- **M1** correctly collects a terms or b terms ($4a$ or $16b$ seen)
- **A1** $4a + 16b$ cao
- **Answer: $4a + 16b$**

Question 9

- (a) **M1** $8x = 56$ (adds 13 to both sides)
- (a) **A1** $x = 7$ cao
- (a) **Answer: $x = 7$**
- (b) **M1** $x/5 = 7$ (subtracts 6 from both sides)
- (b) **A1** $x = 35$ cao
- (b) **Answer: $x = 35$**

Question 10

- **M1** $180 - 58 - 71$ oe
- **A1** 51 (degrees) cao
- **Answer: 51 degrees**

Question 11

- (a) **B1** 168 cm^2 cao
- (a) **Answer: 168 cm^2**
- (b) **M1** $2 \times (21 + 8)$ oe
- (b) **A1** 58 cm cao
- (b) **Answer: 58 cm**

Question 12

- **M1** correct method/setup, e.g. $7 \times 5 \times 8$
- **M1** $7 \times 5 (= 35)$, then 35×8 (or equivalent order of multiplying)
- **A1** 280 cm^3 cao
- **Answer: 280 cm^3**

Question 13

- **M1** $4830 / 1000$ oe
- **A1** 4.83 kg cao
- **Answer: 4.83 kg**

Question 14

- **M1** correct method to find elapsed time, e.g. $10:47$ to $11:00 = 13$ minutes
- **M1** adds the remaining time from $11:00$ to $13:05$ (2 hours 5 minutes)
- **A1** 2 hours 18 minutes cao
- **Answer: 2 hours 18 minutes**

Question 15

- **M1** finds a correct unit price for at least one bag, e.g. $1.35 / 3 = 0.45$ pounds per 100 g, or $3.15 / 7.5 = 0.42$ pounds per 100 g
- **A1** correct conclusion with supporting unit prices: the 750 g bag is better value (0.42 pounds per 100 g compared with 0.45 pounds per 100 g)
- **Answer: The 750 g bag is better value for money**

Question 16

- **M1** total of the five numbers = 220
- **M1** $220 / 5$
- **A1** 44 cao
- **Answer: 44**

Question 17

- **M1** total number of counters = 20
- **A1** $1/4$ oe cao
- **Answer: $1/4$**

Question 18

- **M1** correct method, e.g. continuing the pattern +6 each time to the 18th term, or using n th term = $6n - 2$
- **A1** 106 cao
- **Answer: 106**

Question 19

- **M1** $((6+18)/2, (13+5)/2)$ oe
- **A1** (12, 9) cao
- **Answer: (12, 9)**

Question 20

- **M1** 20% of 540 pounds = 108 pounds (or 540×0.8)
- **M1** $540 - 108$ (= 432 pounds), the sale price
- **A1** 417 pounds cao
- **Answer: 417 pounds**

Question 21

- (a) **B1** 4.5 km/h cao
- **(a) Answer: 4.5 km/h**
- (b) **M1** $40/60$ (= $2/3$) hours, or equivalent method using their (a)
- (b) **A1** 3 km cao
- **(b) Answer: 3 km**

Question 22

- (a) **M1** profit = $8.70 - 6.00$ (= 2.70 pounds)
- (a) **A1** 45% cao
- **(a) Answer: 45%**
- (b) **M1** 20% of 8.70 pounds = 1.74 pounds, or equivalent method (e.g. 8.70×0.8)
- (b) **A1** 6.96 pounds cao
- **(b) Answer: 6.96 pounds**

Question 23

- (a) **B1** $5k + 7 = 82$ oe
- **(a) Answer: $5k + 7 = 82$**
- (b) **M1** $5k = 75$ (subtracts 7 from both sides)
- (b) **A1** $k = 15$ cao
- **(b) Answer: $k = 15$**
- (c) **B1** 26, follow through 2 x their $k - 4$
- **(c) Answer: 26**

Question 24

- (a) **M1** 16×10 (= 160 m^2), the area of the full rectangle
- (a) **M1** 5×4 (= 20 m^2), the area removed
- (a) **A1** 140 m^2 cao
- **(a) Answer: 140 m^2**
- (b) **B1** 1050 pounds, follow through their (a) $\times 7.50$, rounded to the nearest 10 pounds
- **(b) Answer: 1050 pounds**

Question 25

- **M1** total marks for the class of 22 = 22×62 (= 1364)
- **M1** total marks for the class of 28 = 28×75 (= 2100)
- **M1** $(1364 + 2100) / 50$, combining both totals and dividing by 50 pupils
- **A1** 69.3% (1 dp) cao
- **Answer: 69.3% (1 dp)**
